## LIBRARY ON THE MOVE

In 1991, library and community leaders started the process of identifying and addressing needs for increased services and space. With limited space for collection expansion, programming, and a growing demand for audiovisual services and quiet study space, it was clear that the growth of the Library depended on expanding the current location or constructing a new building. Ultimately, leaders chose the option of a new space and location, which launched a long journey to making the current library location at 707 Quay Street a reality.





Library Revenue (Actual) 2016 - 2022


Expense Comparison to Similar Libraries
